

Portions of old mosque demolished in Fatehpur

RAMPUR: Authorities in Uttar Pradesh's Fatehpur district on Tuesday demolished a significant chunk of a 100-year-old mosque that officials alleged was illegally constructed and obstructing a road widening project.

The court in Fatehpur's Lakhimpur Kheri division had earlier issued a stay order after the Supreme Court and the National Green Tribunal rejected petitions for stay injunctions by the mosque's trustees. The judgment had clarified that its directions would not apply to unauthorised constructions on public lands such as roads, footways, and water bodies or in structures under a court of law.

The management committee of the Naujiya Masjid, built in 1923, disputed the authorities' claims and said that they were not facing them by the Allahabad High Court. "The court did not interfere in this action, nor were we allowed to remove any items," said Masud Ali Sadiq, a member of the mosque management committee.

Fatehpur additional district magistrate (ADM) Arunesh Singh Prasad said the demolition was carried out in accordance with the Supreme Court's guidelines. "Our management committee has acknowledged damage of the mosque and has agreed to provide it to the committee to have more convenient access to it. So far, the police filing before the District Court had already issued a notice and date was demolished," he said.

Nadeem created false narrative, court told

NEW DELHI: Human rights activist Nadeem Khan, through "targeted dissemination of selective and misleading information", attempted to create a narrative of persecuting members of a "particular community" as victims of "systematic oppression". local authorities about the mosque allegedly built without permission, on August 24 last year. The蚊子 submitted an application for an injunction that would be restraining the construction process.

However, the court rejected the allegation, holding that the administration had violated the principles of natural justice.

"The extended area of the mosque was declared an encroachment by the public works department (PWD), which

was serving as the administrative office of the district administration," he said.

Before the demolition began, the area within a 200-metre radius of the mosque was sealed off. Police Commissioner and Dy-Commissioner of Police (DyCP) presented various documents of illegal possession, while the bulldozer operator raised a screen of the interior area seven feet, during which traffic on the Kankar Bhenda road was suspended. Traffic resumed once the debris

were cleared. Demos were used to monitor the demolition.

According to PWD officials, any construction within 20 metres on both sides of the old road can be termed encroachment.

But Nadeem said that the PWD did not encroach on any land. He criticised the demolition, saying the case was scheduled for a hearing on December 13, but the high court deferred it to December 21. He added that the administration had cooperated with all directions of the court.

AGUSTAWESTLAND CASE: ED OPPOSES BALI PETITION FILED BY MICHEL

CLINICAL TRIALS IN BURKINA FASO

Blood-stage vaccine for malaria shows promise in trials: Report

BURKINA FASO: A joint malaria vaccine developed by the Indian and French pharmaceutical companies, including Biocon Biologics, showed safe and highly immunogenic in African children and shows promising efficacy against malaria when given in a delayed trial following a phase III clinical trial published in The Lancet Infectious Diseases on Tuesday.

Work is ongoing to further examine the safety and efficacy of the vaccine in the next few months. The results will be presented at the World Health Organization's meeting in Geneva on Friday.

In children, however, the new vaccine is different in the sense that it does not contain the same active ingredient as the first one, which is a combination of RTS,S/AS01E and Mosquirix.

The two malaria vaccines approved currently (RTS,S/AS01E and RDTs/MalariaVax) target the malaria parasite which presents in the blood and are not effective against the blood-stage parasite.

Prof Balaji Srinivas from the Kavli Institute of Nanoscience said, "We now have the exciting opportunity to lay the first WHO I blood-stage vaccine in combination with the approved liver-stage vaccines."

vaccine does give four months after the second or a monthly dose that regimen (RTS,S/AS01E) does three to four months after the second dose.

Participants recruited with RTS,S/MalariaVax showed high concentrations of antibodies with higher responses in those who had the third dose regimen compared to the monthly regimen. Comparing the RTS,S/MalariaVax-dosed individuals with those with the prior monthly regimen, the new vaccine elicited a vaccine efficacy of 50%, while the older one elicited a vaccine efficacy of 15% when compared with the monthly regimen.
