

30 Capital schools sent bomb threats again

Second such incident this week, over 44 Delhi schools had received similar threats on Monday

NEW DELHI: At least 30 schools across Delhi received bomb threats on an email in the early hours of Friday. Aiding in widespread chaos as parents rushed to receive their children from school, the morning rush pulled apart.

Despite Ganesh's week-long absence from the Delhi Police, Delhi Police have 2,075, had nearly 4,000, and nearly 1,000 from each of the 30 schools for Monday.

This is the second such incident this week — on Monday, one of the schools received similar threats. Of the 30 schools for Monday, 22 were reports from Monday.

Police suspect the email was sent to school principals, not to children, but some were 'sent to children' as well.

NEW DELHI: On Friday, Delhi saw the sixth bomb threat targeting schools, paralyzing parents and the morning rush.

"As soon as the school administration was aware of the bomb threat, we locked down the school and sent the parents via SMS and text on their mobile phones," said Anil Jain, manager, Modern International School in Kirti Nagar. He said police arrived in 15-20 minutes.
