SUPPORT PUNJAB FINANCIALLY: MP SAHNEY TO CENTRE

CHANDIGARH: Rajya Sabha member Vikramjit Singh Sahney on Tuesday urged the Centre to support Punjab with suitable budgetary allocation for infrastructure and sanctioning special projects in view of the burgeoning debt over the state. He emphasised the need for covering more industries under production-linked incentive schemes, support for MSMEs, and providing freight subsidy for reducing logistic costs to industry of Punjab to boost exports. The MP stated that for farmers there is a need for a comprehensive approach focusing on MSP reforms, crop diversification, and infrastructure development to support farmers and mitigate ecological challenges. He added that emphasis should be on the significance of cooperative federalism with collaborative efforts among national and regional parties to achieve balanced development across all states without any discrimination.

GAJJANMAJRA'S PLEA AGAINST ED ARREST ADJOURNED

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Tuesday adjourned for July 1 the hearing of a plea filed by Punjab AAP MLA Jaswant Singh Gajjanmajra challenging his arrest and remand by the Enforcement Directorate in a money laundering probe linked to a bank fraud case. A vacation bench of Justices Vikram Nath and SVN Bhatti deferred the hearing of the case as counsel appearing for the ED sought adjournment. The top court had earlier refused to grant interim bail to Punjab AAP MLA to campaign for the ongoing Lok Sabha polls. On May 24, the Punjab and Haryana High Court dismissed his plea challenging his arrest, thereafter, he approached the top court.

The CBI had conducted raids in May 2023 on premises linked to Gajjanmajra in connection with an alleged bank fraud of Rs 40 crore. In September 2022, the ED had conducted raids on several premises linked to him as part of a money laundering probe into the case and seized Rs 32 lakh in cash, some mobile phones and hard drives. 1KG HEROIN, DRONE SEIZED IN AMRITSAR

CHANDIGARH: A drone, more than 1 kg of heroin and a bullet have been seized at two places near the Pakistan border in Amritsar, officials said on Tuesday. The Border Security Force (BSF) recovered 570 grams of heroin and a bullet of a 9x19 mm calibre weapon near Kahanghar village in Amritsar during a search operation on Monday night, a spokesperson of the force said. Near Roranwala village, the BSF and the Punjab Police seized a China-made drone and heroin weighing 550 grams on Monday, an official said. HTc
