Five killed as speeding bus hits truck, falls into drain in Faridkot

30 critically injured | Driver booked | Bus belongs to AAP MLA's firm

At least five persons were killed and 30 others seriously injured this morning when an overspeeding private bus collided with a goods-laden truck and skidded off the Kotkapura-Faridkot road into a drain.

Among the deceased were Simran, a teacher from Kendriya Vidyalaya, and bus conductor Atam Singh. The injured were rushed to Guru Gobind Singh Medical College and Hospital in Faridkot for urgent medical treatment.

Officials said the bus involved in the accident belonged to New Deep Bus Service, a transport company owned by AAP MLA from Gidderbaha, Dimpay Dhillon. The police have registered a case against the bus driver, Kewal Singh, under Section 105 of the BNS Act, which pertains to culpable homicide not amounting to murder.

The case was filed on a complaint by Sukhdeep Singh, a

Bus overturns in Muktsar, 12 hurt

MUKTSAR: At least 12 persons were injured when an overloaded Punjab Roadways bus bound for Abohar overturned near Mehrajwala village on the Muktsar-Malout highway this afternoon. The driver, Major Singh, said nearly 80 passengers were traveling in the bus. "A truck coming from the opposite direction hit the bus on the side, causing it to skid off the road and

overturn. Several passengers and the bus conductor sustained injuries and have been admitted to the hospital," he said. Sources said some onlookers managed to catch hold of the truck driver, who had initially fled. Dr Sunil Bansal, SMO, Malout Civil Hospital, said, "Eight of the injured were brought here. We are providing them with medical assistance." — TNS

Two bikers hurt in mishaps involving Chinese string

Despite the administration's claims that no Chinese string (manjha) was found during recent raids at shops selling kites and related items, two incidents at Gidderanwali village in the district on Tuesday evening highlighted the continued use of the banned material. Two bikers were injured by Chinese string within minutes of each other.

According to reports, 45-year-old Bhala Ram and another individual sustained serious injuries. Bhala Ram, along with his 22-year-old son Sanjay, was travelling to their village, Maughar, on a bike when they witnessed a biker being injured by Chinese string near Gidderanwali. Moments later, the same thread wrapped around Bhala Ram's neck, causing severe injuries to his neck and hand.

Bhala Ram was admitted to a government hospital in Abohar, while the other victim was taken to a private hospital by his family.

Social activist Vipin Sharma said the incident underscored the ongoing danger posed by Chinese string, which continued to be used despite being banned.

SDM's car rams into bike in Patti, 3 of family killed

TARN TARAN, FEBRUARY 18

Seven persons, including three members of a family, were killed in two separate road accidents in Tarn Taran. In one of the incidents, SDM Patti and his official driver were injured.

The first accident occurred on the Tarn Taran-Patti road on Tuesday morning, claiming the lives of three members of a family and injuring SDM Patti and his driver. The second accident took place on the Chabal-Attari road near Dode village late Monday night, where four persons on two motorcycles died in a head-on collision.

Inspector Harpreet Singh Virk, SHO of Patti City Police station, and Lach-

hman Singh, Naib Tehsildar, said SDM Preetinder Singh was travelling from Tarn Taran to Patti in his official vehicle when the incident occurred near Lauhuka village when the

car's tyre burst. The driver lost control of the vehicle which collided head-on with a motorcycle coming from the opposite direction. The motorcycle riders, identified as Sangram

Singh (25) and his mother Rajbir Kaur (45) from Assal village, near Patti, died on the spot. Jashandeep Singh (18), Sangram's cousin, sustained serious injuries and was admitted to a local hospital. He later succumbed to his injuries. The victims were travelling to Tarn Taran to address a social security pension case for Rajbir Kaur at the District Administration Complex.

SDM Preetinder Singh and his driver, Vinder Singh, were admitted to a hospital in Amritsar, where their condition is reported to be stable. SHO Harpreet Singh said the matter was under investigation, and necessary action would be taken.

In the second accident on the Chabal-Attari road, the deceased were identified as Gaurav Singh and his wife Mansi Kaur from Gandivind Sarai, who were travelling to Chabal village, and Rahuldeep Singh and his friend Jashandeep Singh from Gehri village, who were returning to their village from Chabal. The two motorcycles collided head-on near the Dode village bridge late Monday night. Three of the victims died on the spot, while Rahuldeep Singh succumbed to his injuries at a private hospital.

Unions invite SKM to unity talks on February 27

Earlier, the SKM (Non-Political) had withdrawn from the third round of unity talks just hours before the scheduled meeting on February 11.

Excise policy in works; AAP govt eyes up to 7% hike in revenue

CHANDIGARH, FEBRUARY 18

The Punjab Government is planning to increase its revenue from the sale of liquor by approximately 6-7 per cent in the fiscal year 2025-26. The state Excise Department is finalising the liquor policy, which is expected to be presented for approval in the next meeting of the Council of Ministers later this month.

The policy is currently under discussion by a Group of Ministers (GoM) headed by Finance Minister Harpal Cheema, along with ministers Kuldeep Singh Dhaliwal, Tarunpreet Singh Sondhi, and Harbhajan Singh, ETO. A meeting of the GoM was held on Tuesday, during which the ministers suggested certain changes to the proposed policy and asked the department to revise it accordingly. — TNS
