Farmers shunning cultivation of State to seek redevelopment paddy to get 17.5K per hectare

Move aimed at arresting groundwater depletion in state, says Khudian

CHANDIGARH, JULY 20

The Punjab Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Department has decided to provide an incentive of Rs 17,500 per hectare to the farmers who wean away from paddy cultivation and shift to alternative crops. The aim is to encourage farmers to shun waterguzzling paddy crop so as to check groundwater depletion in the state.

Revealing this here today in a press communiqué, Punjab Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Minister Gurmeet Singh Khudian said Rs 289.87 crore had been allocated for this purpose for 2024-25.

Giving breakup of the revamped Crop Diversification Programme (CDP) for replacing paddy, he said any farmer could avail the benefit on maximum five hectares and the incentive

amount would be directly transferred into the bank account of the beneficiary via direct benefit transfer (DBT) in two equal instalments. The first instalment would be transferred immediately

after verification through digital crop survey and Krishi Mapper app, while the second instalment would be paid after the harvesting of

CHANDIGARH, JULY 20 The Punjab Government will seek a redevelopment package and revenue deficit grant from the 16th Finance Commission, which is

expected to arrive here on

Sunday evening.

The government will not just be seeking a post-devolution revenue deficit grant, but also make pitch for a package to rebuild the state's ageing road, power and irrigation infrastructure.

The 15th Finance Commission had given Punjab a post-devolution revenue deficit grant of Rs 25,968 crore for five years. The 13th and 14th Finance Commissions had not given that grant to the state.

The state will seek additional funds from the 16th Finance Commission to help it in its fight against narco-terrorism and war against drugs.

A special package for industrial development in border areas will also be sought. Due to the state being located at the International Border with Pakistan, 35 per cent of its force remains deployed as the second line of defence in border areas. The state government would seek additional funds for the deployment of its police force, said an official source. With the state having the

will also seek higher devolution of funds for their welfare. Additional funds for disaster management will also be sought.

The state government is also expected to highlight how its economy is sagging after the GST rollout and the losses caused by the exclusion of cesses and surcharges, after most state taxes were subsumed.

But the commission's visit this time is being met with some scepticism, especially in the wake of the Centre holding back Punjab's Rs 9,770-crore dues following disagreement with the state's Aam Aadmi Party government on the implementation of various central schemes.

The state government is also apprehensive that it will be under pressure to have a relook at its power subsidy to both agriculture and domestic consumers, before seeking any economic package. The total power subsidy

bill of the state for the ongoing fiscal is Rs 21,909 crore, which the state government will project as its social spending in a welfare state. The government will also maintain that the subsidy to the agricultural sector is being given so that Punjab continues to produce paddy for the nation's food security. Interestingly, neighbour-

ing Himachal Pradesh decided to do away with power subsidy to taxpayers earlier this month. That was done after the visit of the 16th Finance Commission to the hill state, which had flagged the issue of subsidies being given by states in spite of their poor fiscal health.

The six-member team of the commission, led by its Chairman Arvind Panagariya, is expected to hold discussions with the state government's political and executive functionaries on Monday, besides leaders of Opposition parties. The team will then visit Amritsar for a day and meet representatives of trade and industry.

Man arrested for killing wife

The police today claimed to have solved within 48 hours the murder case of a woman whose body was found in a canal yesterday. Woman's husband Jaswant Singh, alias Nikku, has been arrested in connection with the case.

SSP Saumya Mishra said the police registered an FIR following a complaint by deceased Charanjit Kaur's father Major Singh. "In his complaint, Major Singh said his daughter's phone was switched off and he feared that his son-in-law had killed his daughter and thrown her body into the canal," the SSP said.

Charanjit Kaur was married to Jaswant Singh seven years ago and the couple had two children. Jaswant Singh allegedly used to harass and assault her regularly.

Major Singh said Jaswant had taken Charanjit Kaur with him from their house on July 13. Since then, her phone was switched off. When Major Singh reached Ferozepur in search of his daughter, he come to know that Jaswant had killed her and thrown her body into the canal, the SSP said.

The police investigation revealed that Jaswant Singh brutally murdered Charaniit Kaur in the fields and then threw her body into the canal. Jaswant Singh was arrested from Mishriwala village. He would be produced in a court tomorrow,

on convicts in jails due to delay in filing appeals

CHANDIGARH, JULY 20 A convict in a drug case continued to remain in jail even after virtually completing his 10-year rigorous imprisonment sentence due to delayed filing of an appeal. Expressing shock over the absence of serious efforts in providing him legal assistance for filing the appeal,

the Punjab and Haryana High Court has enlarged the scope of the matter before directing the states of Punjab and Haryana, along with UT Chandigarh, to furnish a response on the issue, along with details of other such inmates and steps taken to provide timely legal aid.

Justice Rajesh Bhardwaj said there might be other prisoners lodged in jails across the two states and Chandigarh who may not be made aware

by timely challenging their conviction and sentence".

Justice Bhardwaj said challenging the order of sentence and conviction was a convict's legal right and it could not be taken away or curtailed for any reason whatsoever when the government had provided legal aid counsels to visit jail premises and meet the prisoners.

The court has sought details as regards the number of convicts lodged in the jails of Haryana and Punjab, who did not timely file appeals in higher courts. Details of their conviction and sentence awarded by the courts were also called for.

Justice Bhardwaj also asked the authorities concerned to specify the steps taken by the jail authorities to apprise the convicts of their legal right to challenge their conviction and sentence and the reasons behind delay in matters where the appeals were filed late through legal aid.

Justice Bhardwaj further asked for details of procedure and time schedule adopted by the jail authorities to provide timely legal aid to the convicts.

Justice Bhardwaj observed the appeal was filed after 894 days' delay. The convict, in Ludhiana Central Jail, had already undergone imprisonment for over eight years, including four years and eight months in custody after conviction.

5 Army men injured in Jalandhar mishap

Five Army personnel were injured in a collision between an Army truck and a private truck loaded with onions on Jalandhar-Amritsar national highway near Suchi Pind today. The incident occurred around 6 am. Two soldiers sustained serious injuries in the accident.

According to preliminary reports, both vehicles were headed towards Amritsar when the private truck rear-ended the Army truck near Suchi Pind. The driver of the Army truck lost control of the vehicle that crashed through the divider grills and overturned on the opposite side of the road. The private truck also crashed into the divider.

The Sadak Surakhya Force and officials from the Rama Mandi police station reached the spot and the injured soldiers were taken to a military hospital for treatment. The accident led to a four-hour-long traffic jam on the highway until the situation was restored and the damaged vehicles were towed away. According to the police, two injured are in a serious condition, while the other three have sustained minor injuries. According to the CCTV

Woman peddler among three held with 1kg ICE

The police have seized 1 kg ICE, 2.45 kg heroin and 520 precursor pseudoephedrine and arrested three persons, including woman drug peddler Daljit Kaur (42), who is a resident of Kot Khalsa. Gurbax, alias Lala (27), and Arshdeep Singh (21), both residents of the Chheharta area, were arrested for drug trafficking two days ago.

DGP Gauray Yaday said Gurbax was the kingpin of the racket. "Daljit Kaur was arrested by the police with 50 gm heroin on June16. A disclosure by her led the police



to Arsheep Singh from whom the police seized 200 gm heroin. Following further investigation, the police arrested Gurbax following an operation under the supervision of Additional Deputy

Commissioner of Police Dr Darpan Ahluwalia. The police seized 1 kg ICE, over 2 heroin and kg precursor doephedrine from his possession," the DGP said.

Amritsar Police Commissioner Ranjit Singh Dhillon said Gurbax had five criminal cases against him and he was in and out of the jail in Gurdaspur and Amritsar. He was out on bail since March this year. He said his links were also traced and raids were being conducted to arrest them too. Arshdeep, who faces a case

under the NDPS Act, was out on bail since March last year. He said Gurbax was sourcing precursor chemical and adulterated crude heroin to increase its effect, besides manufacturing crystal ICE, a party drug. He used to earn a commission of Rs 50,000 per consignment.
